The Four Purposes of TANF

The Coshocton County Department of Job and Family Services is responsible for the administration of the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program in Coshocton County. The four purposes of TANF are:

1. Provide assistance to needy families so that children may be cared for in their own homes or in the homes of relatives.*
2. End dependence of needy parents on government benefits by promoting job preparation, work and marriage.*
3. Prevent and reduce the incidence of out-of-wedlock pregnancies and establish annual numerical goals for preventing and reducing the incidence of these pregnancies.
4. Encourage the formation and maintenance of two-parent families.

* Note: individuals served in these two areas must meet income eligibility criteria.

- Eligible assistance groups include a minor child under age 18, full-time high school student up to his/her 19th birthday, or pregnant individual.
- Services are also available to non-custodial parents of a minor eligible child who resides in the county but does not live in the same household as the minor child.
- An eligible family may consist of a pregnant individual or minor child who resides with parent, caretaker relative, legal guardian, or legal custodian.
- An eligible child may be "temporarily absent" from the home, up to six months, with a case plan for reunification.
- In order to receive services, a member of the assistance group must be a citizen of the United States or a qualified alien.
